



From the Manse



Many of you will already be aware that I will be away for six weeks on study leave.

The course I will be taking is run by The School of Theology at Toronto University. It runs from 22nd May until 22nd June) The requirements of the course are: Lectures, readings, group discussions, practical skill-building projects, two congregational study assignments and short papers. I will be staying on campus in student

accommodation and all that entails.....sharing kitchen and bathroom facilities.

I am stepping out in faith believing that God will supply all my needs on this adventure of learning. I am very excited about it, and I can't help but smile when I talk about it.... which leads some people to think I'm having an extended holiday J The truth is I do find it very exciting to have this great learning opportunity. Many years ago God spoke clearly to me about study, it's a long story so I'll not bore you with all the details, suffice to say that Paul's words to Timothy 'study to show yourself approved' (2 Timothy 2.15) were used by God to encourage me on my first stage of theological study... a short course by distance learning, I thought that was it.... there followed a period of study for an Honours degree in theology at Bible college in Glasgow.... and I thought, that was it.... no, God had other plans and I went on to do a Masters Degree in Theology at New College, Edinburgh, and if I thought my time of study was over, how wrong I was! This is a short, but intense course and did I say I was excited about it? But it's not all about me. The reason Paul encouraged Timothy to study was to show himself approved as one who correctly explains the word of truth to others. You are 'the others' in my ministry.

My main aim in undertaking this course is to become more effective in leading the congregation to develop vision and so engage in mission

in ways that are meaningful for the context in which we live, and appropriate to, and achievable by, the exercise of gifts within the congregation. (that's the statement for the Ministries Council, it means quite simply that I want to be the best I can be as together, we seek to serve God in this community)

You see it's not all about me, the benefits of the course for the church will certainly depend on my hard work and the desire of the congregation to develop vision and engage in mission.

This is the background to Study Leave.

It was decided in 1997, by the General Assembly, that study leave should be introduced for Ministers serving in parishes. Entitlement begins with two weeks at five years' service, four weeks at six years, and so on, increasing to a maximum entitlement of 14 weeks for those with twelve years of service in the Church. The Ministries Council fund study leave to the amount of £275 for each year of entitlement. There is no extra cost to the congregation when the Minister is on study leave.

The concept of Sabbatical Leave was not considered to be appropriate, (i.e. this is not to be a holiday/rest for the Minister, neither is it to be used as a means of rehabilitating ministers who require time off for other reasons). These were to be well constructed times of study that would be of benefit to the church and should rigorously uphold the ideals of continuing education and personal development. A report on the time of study is to be submitted to Presbytery within three months of return from leave. The Ministries Council has the last word on whether the study leave application is appropriate and meets the requirements of the General Assembly.

I am pleased to say that the course I have chosen has met with the approval of the Ministries Council and with Presbytery.


Thank you

 these clubs.
- Volunteers. There are significant opportunities for volunteering in areas like
 the new listening service, chill, chaplaincy and youth café. Give thanks for Matt
 Sinar volunteering a half day a week with the Project.
- SU camps. BUSY subsidise places for young people who are involved in the Project to attend SU camp. Give thanks for a recent donation towards this work. Pray that the right young people will be given the opportunity to go and take this opportunity!
- Successful applications for funding from a large number of Trusts, especially the Jerusalem Trust and the Gannochy Trust.
- Continued and increased support from local Christians and organisations in volunteering, praying and financially.

FOCC



I am delighted to advise that new host families have signed up and we are increasing the number of children in our group this year from 17 to 22. That means we will be making a huge positive impact on the lives of an extra 5

children and their families and that is a great feeling to have. We are now the largest group out of the 33 FOCC groups in the UK. That is down to the kindness of the host parents in our group and the number of great supporters we have and I cannot thank them all enough. You all make a huge difference to these very needy young children and their families and it is very much appreciated.

On 9th March I will be going to Belarus for a week with Shirley MacGillivray and Clare Cotton from our group as part of the charities official annual visit. During that trip we will :-

Host a party in the villages for our 14 village children to attend with their siblings and an adult. There will be lots of food for them to eat and each child will get a small toy and some chocolate/sweets.

Host a similar party in Mogilev for our 3 city children who will be joined by the city children from the Edinburgh group

Meet all 14 children from the various villages in their homes with their parents. During that visit they will be given a food parcel and (reusable bags for life, a top up of paracetamol and vitamins, elastoplasts, stock cubes, tea bags, toothpaste and toothbrush, chocolate and sweets all of which will be taken from the UK as they are very expensive to get in Belarus) We will pass on letters/photos/money/extra food from their host families and get feedback on what difference FOCC is making to them and how much they appreciate what the charity and the hosts do for them.

Similarly we will meet all of our 3 city children in their own homes.

Meet a number of possible new children and select the number required for our group and revisit them to advise them of the good news that they have been selected and pass on letters/photos etc from their new hosts and provide food parcel etc as above. Our trip will not be an easy one and we will come across radioactive contamination, poverty, poor or no sanitation, corruption and all you would expect of a former Soviet state. We know that our every move will be followed by the KGB and our conversations and telephone calls listened to by them. However we are not afraid to go there as we know that God will be with us as we carry his love to the children.

Please remember our trip in your prayers - That we may be able to do all that we plan to do while we are there and return home safely to carry on this great work.

Hearing the Word

On Friday 29 and Saturday 30 January, Rev Nigel Barge came along to Broxburn and introduced us to an exciting way of exploring the Bible. It is all about asking questions, first we **LOOK** at the passage and ask questions about it, only questions, no answers at this stage. When we've asked all the questions (all questions are allowed and there is no silly question) we move to **LEARN** – together we work through the questions, discussing possible answers, bringing in other relevant parts of the Bible which help lead us to our conclusions.

We then **LISTEN** – what is the main point in the passage, is there a verse which sums it up? Often there are different ideas and as we discuss our thoughts we usually come to an agreement about what the passage is teaching us.

After we **LOOK, LEARN** and **LISTEN**, we think of how this might affect how we **LIVE**. What does the passage tell us about God, what might God have expected the first readers to do in response, what might God want us to do, individually or as a group.

Solomon, said "Let the wise hear and increase in learning, and the one who understands obtain guidance," (proverbs 1:5)

We have been exploring some passages from the book of Mark, some have been easier than others. We will begin a new exploration of the book of Philippians on Sunday 15 April – Sunday 6 May, 6pm in the small hall. The cost of the material is £3. Orders for the material will be taken soon.
