Yes, it's back! After a year's break and having reached most of the finance required the Princes Street Easter Play is back in April 2017. This production is returning to traditional costume and an update of the original script.

I know, you're thinking "what has this got to do with me." Had you ever thought about becoming involved in bringing Christ to the heart of the City at Easter?

There are opportunities to be part of the cast, with no need to learn lines. There has to be a crowd when the tables are

overturned at the temple; we've never quite made 5,000 for feeding but we'd like to get close and the crowd is given the choice of shouting for Jesus or Barabbas in front of Pilate. You know the story but there are so many who don't and the chance to put forward the real Easter story is a privilege. Age is no barrier to taking part! We have babes in arms and nonagenarians involved, just as would have been at in Jerusalem at the time of Jesus' crucifixion.

If walking about Princes Street Gardens in fancy dress is not your scene then how about helping with costumes, catering, construction or stewarding nearer the time? There's the Information Tent to be staffed because people are inevitably touched by seeing the gospel story lifted off the pages of the Bible and acted out before their eyes. They want to know what's going on and many non-Christian tourists in Edinburgh may have no idea at all of Bible truths. Not least come and watch. A large audience is a great witness to tourists, passers-by and those who normally use the Gardens for leisure.

If you still don't see how you can be involved, then try praying; for safety moving around the Gardens, for good weather, for the remaining finance needed, for good conversations and for the telling of the true story of Easter to people who haven't heard it. The list is endless!

Crèche

Defibrillator

The sharp eyed among you will already have noticed that we have installed a defibrillator next to the pay phone in the corridor leading to the small hall. A defibrillator or AED as it's also known, is a device which will give a high energy electric shock to the heart through the chest wall, to someone who is in cardiac arrest.

If someone does have a sudden cardiac arrest, their chances of survival fall by 7-10% with every minute that defibrillation is delayed. Often the emergency services are unable to attend and provide vital defibrillation quickly enough, so if we are able to use our AED we could save someone's life.

The defibrillator and training for volunteers were paid for at no cost to the church. We received £190 from Jimmy King of Uphall South, which was the surplus monies he had raised for their device. Thank you Jimmy. We made a successful application to the Scotmid Community Fund for £500 and the shortfall was met by an anonymous donation from two of our members which was wonderful. Stefan Hickman and Mags Black, First Responders from Bathgate and Broxburn trained 19 willing volunteers one evening in CPR and use of the AED. These included 2/3 members from each Sunday duty team, our Minister, and representatives from the various church and outside groups who use our halls. Some of the volunteers are already trained through their work.

By positioning the defibrillator in the corridor it should be quickly and easily accessible to everyone.



Welcoming in our local community

We've recently been looking at increasing use of our halls by the local community.

The halls are looking good, having been repainted, and with new window blinds in place and new flooring in the small hall. We can offer local groups a warm, safe and welcoming place to meet. Since the Summer we have had a number of outside groups meeting in the halls, including Scottish Slimmers (who plan to restart in January), Young Engineers (a group for children learning through building Lego



and Knex models) and the Livingston Arts Group (who you might remember had a stand at the Flower Festival). We've also had a tai-chi group and Zumba class taking place when they couldn't use their normal halls.

In April a local lady will use both our halls for a family fun day to raise funds for Cancer Research. A group for

Adults with Learning Disabilities and their families is also looking to start meeting in the big hall next year. This is in addition to our regular Church groups and the Mother and Toddlers, Food Bank, fitness class for the Swimming club, and of course FOCC for their twice yearly visits of children from Belarus.

We're also looking to host children's parties for Primary School aged children.

It's great to see our halls being used more and it also helps us to raise vital money for the upkeep of our buildings.

We had 11 children with us for a month over August/September. They are a lovely group of children, mainly 8 years old, who were mostly on their second visit with us. We had great fun outings to soft play centre, swimming pools, deep

sea world, Polkemmet park and Scottish owl centre, potter around, Kelpies, Hopetoun house, Hatton Mains Tennis Club, Edinburgh Zoo, the craigs scout camp, 10 pin bowling, silver sands beach, St Margaret's school, canal boat trip, Beecraigs as well as some great craft, singing and dancing days in the halls and less fun but necessary trips to the dentist and optician. The host families and supporters/helpers ensured that the children had a great month and when the month came to an end they went home much healthier and happier with a full suitcase of clothes, vitamins, toys and essentials we take for granted. At the time of writing this we are just about to leave for our Autumn trip to Belarus. Three volunteers will travel and visit all of our June group children in their homes taking them food and also letters and love from their host families. We will also gather both our June Group and September group children past and present for 2 separate parties in 2 different areas. Its always interesting and exciting to meet new children and families and on this visit we will be looking for 5 new children to replace the 5 children who completed their time with us in June. We look forward to welcoming them and getting to know them as we help them over the next 5 years. The weather forecast for the visit is very cold with the warmest day to be -2 and the coldest -9, but that's fairly typical of this time of year and the long Johns have been packed. It may be cold but I am sure we will feel the warmth from the people we meet.

Our planning is already underway for both of our visits for next year. We will welcome 21 children in June and 12 in August/September. We know that we cant do all of this ourselves and our work is only possible

through the kindness of others. We would like to say a huge thanks to the church and our many supporters in the congregation for their kindness and prayerful support throughout this year. It is very much appreciated.
