FROM THE INTERIM MODERATOR

Dear friends,

Since I last wrote to you, the Presbytery Plan has been moving forward. After earlier discussions with Strathbrock and Uphall South Churches, the Kirk Session resolved on 30th September to support the idea of a three-way union with the other two Churches. When it was considered in early October, the Presbytery Plan said the following:

Broxburn, Strathbrock and Uphall South are asked to form a three-way union overseen by 1FTMWS and 0.5 MDS (Community Project). The churches have a history of working together and promoting community involvement. A number of initiatives, such as the BUSY project, should continue to reach into schools. Ecumenical links continue to be encouraged as are other outreach projects, such as SOYA. The congregations are encouraged to use their missional energy and drive to reach out to the new housing in the area (Bangour) and the growing population. A wise use of the buildings is important here, with a mix of the older and the refurbished. Choices will be required in order to find the well-equipped spaces in the right place.

Buildings: With these congregations moving towards closer cooperation and Union, decisions regarding buildings are vital. It is proposed, therefore, that St. Machan's, which is used less fully and located less centrally, be designated 'B' and released by 31 December 2025. The other churches provide complementary mission locales and should be designated 'A', although there would be great value in creating a flexible worship and community space at Uphall South that could complement St. Nicholas.

(**Notes:** FTWMS – Full-time Minister of Word and Sacrament. MDS – Mission Development Staff. 'A' = building to be retained. 'B' building to be released).

The designation of our buildings at Broxburn as 'A' means that the Presbytery sees these as being necessary for the future mission of the Church. A number of congregations have responded to the plan, and a revised version will be going to the Presbytery of Edinburgh and West Lothian in mid-November, hopefully for final approval. It is not anticipated that this will make any change to the proposals for us.

As I said before, I recognise that these are difficult and uncertain times, but things are moving forward and becoming clearer. Hopefully after November, we will be able to consider how the proposed union might be taken forward. There is a formal process to enable this to happen and will involve all members of the congregation.

Treasurer's Update

Well, where has this year gone? It's hard to believe that 2022 is now drawing to a close. Although it has been a wee while since my last magazine update, I have been keeping the Board updated with our financial position on a month by month basis.

Our finances are in a better position than I predicted at the start of the year, thanks to your ongoing generosity, to a resurgence in hall lets and restarting our hospitality events. In each of the last 6 months, to the end of September, our income has exceeded our expenditure – a fantastic position to be in!

Having developed a Covid-safe way of operating, we now have monthly coffee bars on the first Saturday of the month, with home-baking delivered to your table – no more queuing! We've also managed to hold two afternoon teas, in August and October, greatly enjoyed by all who attended, and have been able to offer hospitality after church every Sunday. These have combined to bring in over £3,000! Our hall lets have added another £5,000! We have also benefitted from a £1,200 donation from the Bridge Choir as they sadly disbanded. Thank you to all the choir members.

Expenses have so far been less than budgeted for but with winter fast approaching heating/lighting expenses will soon start to ramp up. And some of our regular maintenance work as well as the renewal of the licences we need to allow us to play music, record and stream services etc are both coming up so we still have some hefty expenses to come. However I'm hopeful that we will still end the year in a much stronger financial position that anticipated at the start of the year.

Our biggest fundraising event, the Christmas Fayre on Saturday 3rd December, makes a welcome return this year after an enforced absence due to Covid, and we hope to see you there.



Recipe Corner...Recipe Corner

Gingerbread biscuits

It's the time of year when gingerbread men make their big entrance so why not try this recipe and make your own. You can shape these biscuits however you want – they don't have to be cut like gingerbread men – but did you know that an upside-down gingerbread man can be decorated to look like a reindeer's head? (The legs become the antlers and the arms become the ears.) They taste delicious so why not have some fun with this recipe?

Ingredients

350g plain flour

- 1-2 teaspoons ground ginger
- 1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
- 100g butter
- 175g light brown sugar
- 1 egg
- 4 tablespoons black treacle



(For a seasonal spiced flavour try adding ½ teaspoon of cinnamon, a pinch of nutmeg and some freshly grated orange rind along with the ginger).

Method

- 1. Preheat your oven to 190 degrees C (Gas Mark 5).
- 2. Sift flour, spices and bicarb into a bowl and rub in the butter.
- 3. Add the sugar to the mixture and stir in the treacle and the egg to create a firm dough
- 4. Roll out on a flour-dusted surface to a thickness of around 5mm and cut out your gingerbread shapes.
- 5. Place the shapes onto a greased/lined baking tray, leaving plenty of space between them. Bake for 10 to 15 minutes.

Introduction:

In this passage, Jesus is at a dinner party in a well-to-do part of town. What happens next is shocking – everybody knows what kind of woman this is – and yet Jesus allows her to anoint him and to wipe his feet with her hair.

Text: Luke 7:36-50

One of the Pharisees asked Jesus to have dinner with him, so Jesus went to his home and sat down to eat. When a certain immoral woman from that city heard he was eating there, she brought a beautiful alabaster jar filled with expensive perfume. Then she knelt behind him at his feet, weeping. Her tears fell on his feet, and she wiped them off with her hair. Then she kept kissing his feet and

putting perfume on them. When the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would know what kind of woman is touching him. She's a sinner!" Then Jesus answered his thoughts. "Simon," he said to the Pharisee, "I have something to say to you." "Go ahead, Teacher," Simon replied. Then Jesus told him



this story: "A man loaned money to two people—500 pieces of silver to one and 50 pieces to the other. But neither of them could repay him, so he kindly forgave them both, cancelling their debts. Who do you suppose loved him more after that?" Simon answered, "I suppose the one for whom he cancelled the larger debt."

"That's right," Jesus said. Then he turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Look at this woman kneeling here. When I entered your home, you didn't offer me water to wash the dust from my feet, but she has washed them with her tears and wiped them with her hair. You didn't greet me with a kiss, but from the time I first came in, she has not stopped kissing my feet. You neglected the courtesy of olive oil to anoint my head, but she has anointed my feet with rare perfume. "I tell you, her sins—and they are many—have been forgiven, so she has shown me much love. But a person who is forgiven little shows only little love." Then Jesus said to the woman, "Your sins are forgiven." The men at the table said among themselves, "Who is this man, that he goes around forgiving sins?" And Jesus said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace."



Points to Ponder:

One writer has said this: "If we consider ourselves deserving of having Jesus in our lives, we'll act towards him like the Pharisee did. He did what might have been expected of him, but no more. He treated Jesus with respect but did not love him. However, if we realise that we are like the woman, owing God an infinite debt, and piling up more and more debt each day, then we'll treat Jesus like she did. She didn't care what others thought of her. There was nothing she wouldn't do for him. She loved him.


If we've grasped Christ's forgiveness, we will offer every part of our lives to him. There will be no part of our life that is held back. While we may weep with grief at our sin, there will be tears of joy at our forgiveness. We too will love him."

Prayer:

Loving Father, forgive us for the times when we act from misguided motives and think that we are better than others. Help us to love others as you have loved us. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

Action:

Think about your own life. Admit to Jesus the ways in which you have sinned recently – where you have fallen short. Acknowledge that you deserve nothing from him; thank him with all your heart for his forgiveness; and offer all that you have and are to him.
