The great news is that we are now over half way towards our target of £200 for the 'Let us Build a House' project. Thanks to all those who have already donated a pound, but we still need more to complete our house of bricks on the wall of the large hall. Remember that the Nepal earthquake 18 months ago left 8,000 people dead and 6 million families homeless.

Each house will cost £500 to build, and West Lothian Presbytery has asked every congregation to try to raise £200 for this project.

£1 buys a brick, so if you'd like to help us reach our target please put your £1 in the jar provided and write your name on one of the labels. We'll stick this onto a brick for you and that will help to keep track of our progress towards our target of £200. We can do it!
